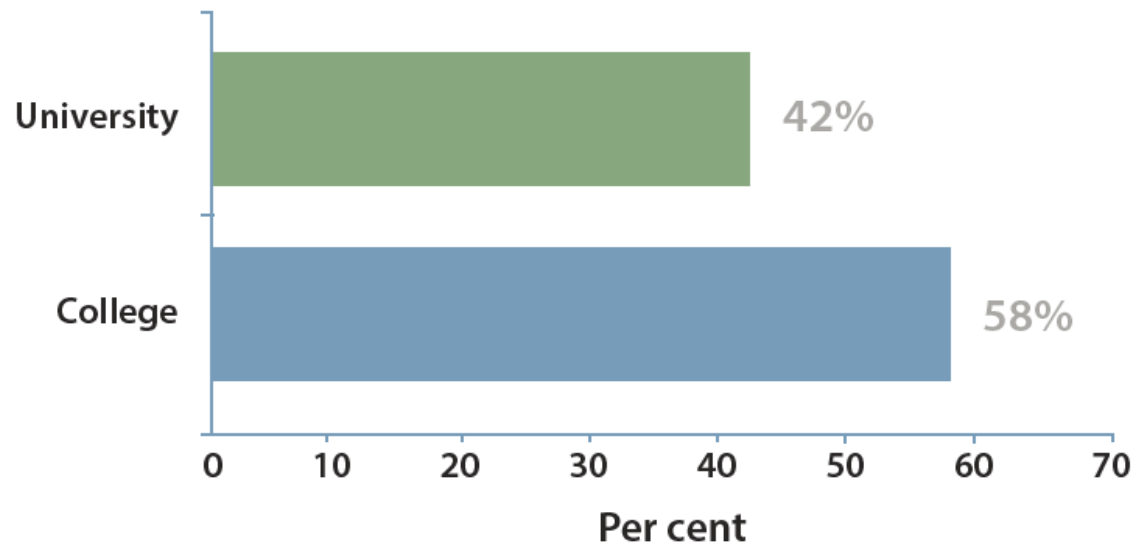

2014 Fall post-secondary commencements in Ontario

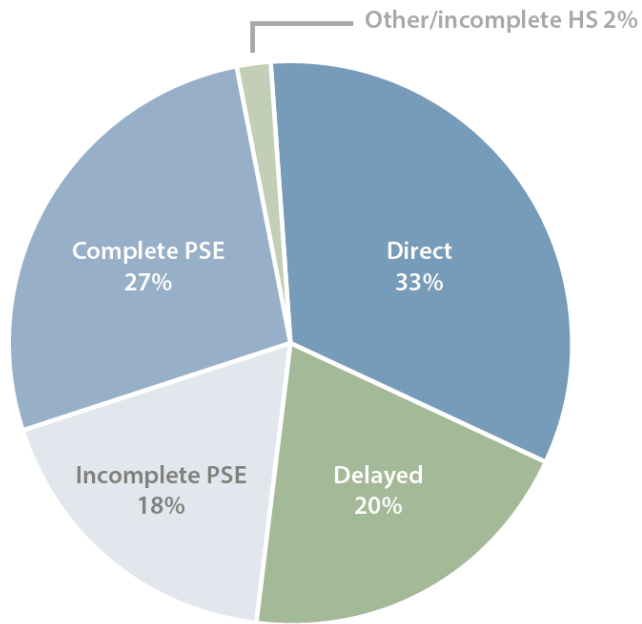

College or University?

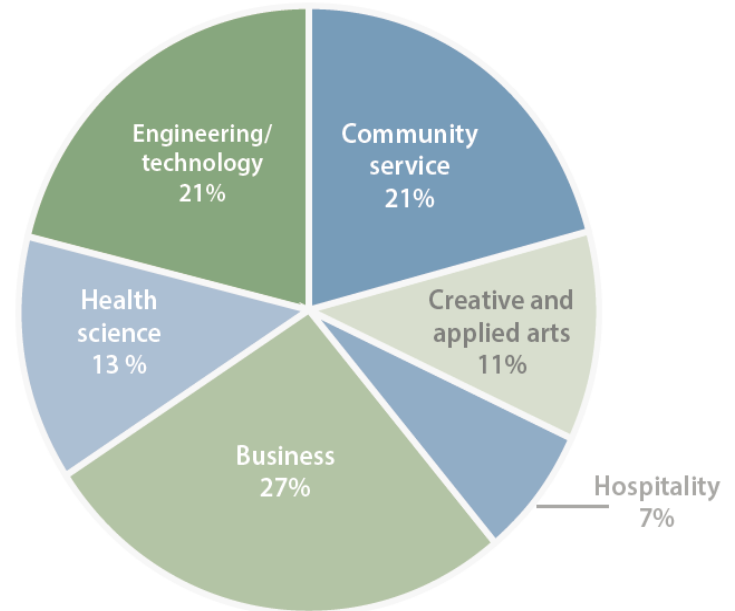
Level of Education – pathways to college

College graduates by employment sector

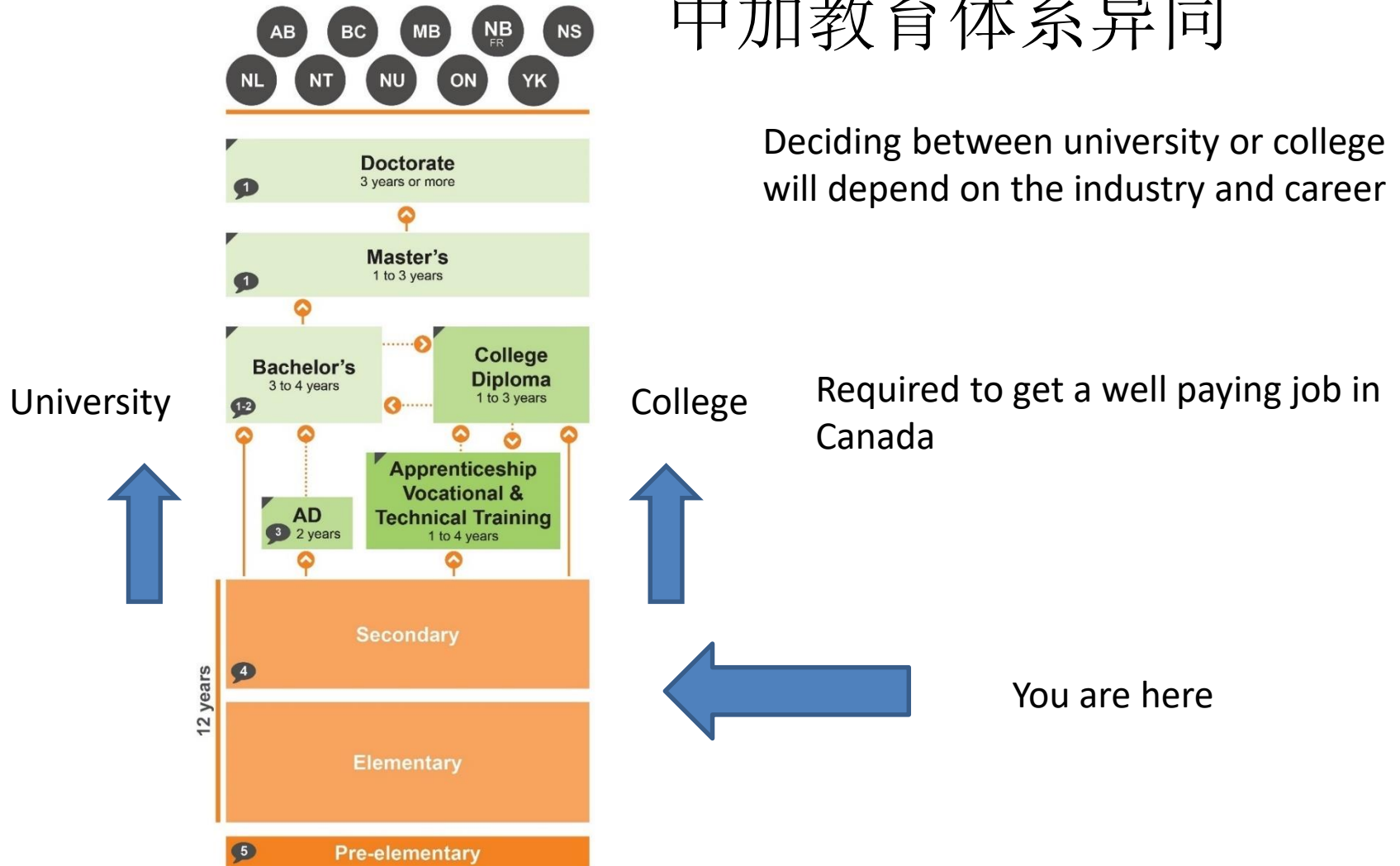

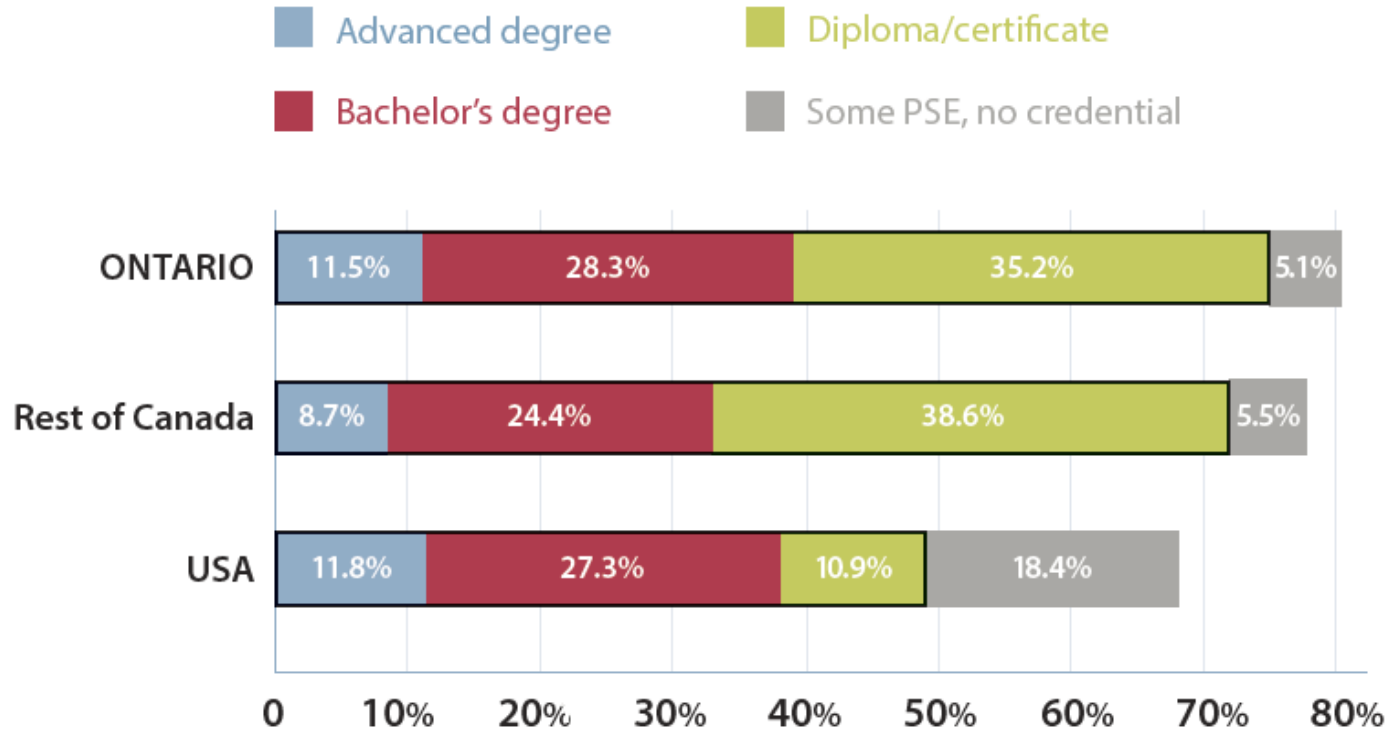
